- Hosted a community garden started after Hurricane Iselle and created Kumukahi Emergency Relief Center, supporting our Kapoho residents in emergency disaster with the support of Civil Defense and Bodacious Ladies of Puna.
- Community activist hosting public events and education on Rat Lungworm Disease.

- Hawaiiin rights advocate, getting Hawaiiins housed in Hawaiiin Homelands and intertwining Hawaiiin Cultural knowledge into the lives of all residents to learn important knowledge and sustainable actions from our stars to the ocean.
- Supporting green waste programs in Puna, not only depending on government program funding, but creating entrepreneurial thinking and economics from Puna to Kau.
